


WORKING WITH FAMILIES TO PREVENT CHILD MALTREATMENT

DID YOU KNOW?

Data from the 2016 National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services indicated that just 3.3% of outpatient substance use treatment facilities in Colorado provide child care. For many parents and caregivers, especially those with infants or young children, lack of access to child care is a barrier to accessing substance use disorder treatment programs (World Drug Report, 2015).

Before a parent can begin to address any complex issue impacting their family, like mental health concerns, substance use disorders, or employment challenges, they are too often faced, first, with struggling to find child care.

And that's where **Illuminating Child Care** comes in. Through the use of Recreational Vehicles (RVs) that have been retrofitted into infant and toddler classrooms, this program provides safe, on-site, drop-in child care for families and caregivers engaged in substance use disorder treatment and behavioral health programming. This resource truly is the first of its kind anywhere in the country.

Caramel, Illuminating Child Care's newest member of the fleet, was introduced to the Pueblo community at an open house in April of 2022. Members of the community and local media were able to tour the new classroom, learn more about the program, and see how the on-site classroom operates.

"[If] we can support parents in... really being able to be present and well for their kiddos, then we can support children in building all of those brain connections that we know happens in early childhood. IMPACT HIGHLIGHT Connecting Every Family to a Healthy Future

As the State Intermediary for Family Connects, Illuminate played a crucial role in bringing this evidence-based home visitation model to life in Colorado in 2022, supporting effective scaling and sustainability for Family Connects throughout the state.

The Family Connects model is designed to support the health and well-being of **ALL** newborns and their families by offering one to three home visits by a highly-trained registered nurse and connections to resources families can access in their communities.

The launch of the program in Eagle and Boulder Counties in late 2022 marked a significant milestone, filled with promise and hope for the future. Working hand in hand with Family Connects International and local partners, impact has already been felt through this new and exciting program.

As Illuminate continues to expand Family Connects across the state, the excitement for the potential impact continues to grow as well.

DID YOU KNOW?

Results from past and ongoing randomized controlled trials of the Family Connects program included:

- Half as many emergency room visits and hospital stays for infants
- Decreased anxiety among mothers
- Improved home environments and home safety
- Increased community connections
- Mothers more likely to complete their 6-week postpartum health visit
- Reduction in investigations of child maltreatment through age two

These outcomes are shown to be even more significant for families of color, compared to white families.



IMPACT HIGHLIGHT Flourishing in Times of Change

In 2022, along with our partners and funders in the Colorado Department of Early Childhood and the Colorado Department of Human Services, Illuminate welcomed nearly 600 multi-disciplinary professionals and Family Voice representatives from all over the state to Pueblo, Colorado for the **Strengthening Colorado Families and Communities Conference**.

Since the Strengthening Colorado Families and Communities Conference takes place every two years, this was the first year since 2018 that the Conference took place in person. The conference theme, Flourishing in Times of Change, acknowledged the many changes that professionals, parents, and caregivers have had to make over the last few years while also providing the space to rest, rejuvenate, and build resilience.

The funders, planning committee, and Illuminate were dedicated to providing a space where each conference participant would grow in their knowledge of effective child abuse prevention strategies, family support, and protective factors that strengthen families through active participation in workshop sessions, networking, dedicated time for wellbeing, and robust discussions. Between 51 breakout sessions and 3 keynote presentations, there were also opportunities and reminders every day for conference attendees to focus on their own well-beingincluding small physical items like a miniature succulent and quick 10-minute crafts like a glitter jar that attendees could keep as a physical reminder to take care of themselves and breathe in moments of stress, uncertainty, or change. No wonder the 2022 Conference had a 96% satisfaction rate among attendees!



IMPACT HIGHLIGHT Advancing Systems of Care

The year of 2022 saw the launch of the Colorado Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems (CO-ECCS): Health Integration Prenatal-to-Three Project, an initiative funded by a five-year grant awarded to the Colorado Department of Early Childhood (CDEC) in August 2022. Illuminate Colorado was selected by the CDEC to ensure the successful implementation of the goals and activities over the funded project period.

The grant aims to improve Colorado's maternal and early childhood care for children from prenatal to three years old (P-3) so that all children can be healthy, thriving, and have equal access to services and resources. The CO-ECCS project aims to do this by integrating and aligning Colorado's health system with the broader maternal and early childhood system. This will help increase access to services, promote best practices and health innovations, and ensure that family leadership is included in state decision-making and planning, with a focus on fairness and equity.

Here are a few of the major accomplishments from the year:

- Formation of the ECCS Working Group. This group was established as a working group of the Early Childhood Leadership Council (ECLC) to provide guidance and assistance in the systems-building work of the Project.
- Identification of key opportunities in the **System Asset and Gaps Analysis (SAGA)**, giving a broad overview of the early childhood system and confirming many of the opportunities Colorado identified in the grant's application.
- **Integration of five ECCS strategies** to the Colorado Shines Brighter Birth through Five Strategic Plan (CSB SP), also endorsed by the Early Childhood Leadership Commission (ECLC).
- **Partnership with Solutions Consulting Co.,** whose team serves as Equity Consultant to the Project. They are helping to strategically guide and support the CO-ECCS project by contributing expert knowledge in assessment, training, and system transformation rooted in equity, diversity, and inclusion.

IMPACT HIGHLIGHT Growing a Better Tomorrow Across Colorado

Child Abuse Prevention Month is an important time of year for so many organizations and individuals working tirelessly year-round to strengthen families and protect children. As the Colorado Chapter of Prevent Child Abuse America, Illuminate led partners across the state in the Pinwheels for Prevention® campaign.

For the first time since 2019, people were able to come together in person to launch the annual Pinwheels for Prevention® campaign, but that was just the beginning of the month-long awareness campaign.

With 10 sponsors, 54 partner organizations, an in-person and virtual launch event at the State Capitol, a Governor's Proclamation, tributes in the Colorado State House of Representatives and Senate, a \$2,500 mini grant awarded to a local organization working to strengthen families in Colorado, free child sexual abuse prevention trainings, pinwheel distribution, and federal legislative advocacy, April was jam-packed with opportunities for individuals and organizations across the state to get involved in growing a better tomorrow for all children, together.

When parents, caregivers, family, friends, neighbors, employers, and elected leaders work together to increase five critical protective factors in families' lives, that is when we can prevent child abuse, strengthen families, and build brighter childhoods.






